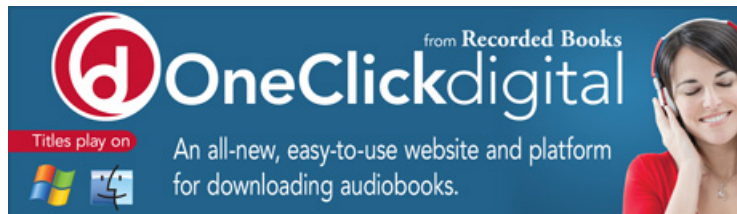

### Download Books & Audiobooks at Home

The Canajoharie Library has expanded its services with audiobooks, and eBooks, available to download from the library's website. Our brand new ebook (digital books you can read on a computer or portable device) service is with the vendor Overdrive. Our recently revamped audiobook (audiobooks you download to your computer or portable device) services is through One Click Digital. Library card holders can check out and download digital media anytime, anywhere by visiting [canajoharielibrary.org](http://canajoharielibrary.org).

Browse the library's website, check out with a valid library card, and download to PC, Mac®, and many mobile devices. Users will need to install free software. Our new ebooks will work on most portable

devices including Nooks, ipads, and Kindles. You are allowed to have up to 3 ebooks checked-out at a given time. If the book you want is being borrowed you can place a digital hold! You are able to have up to 5 holds on your account at a time. eBooks can also be returned early to allow the next person on the hold list to borrow the book. Titles will automatically expire at the end of the lending period. We have a huge selection of fiction, non-fiction, teen books, and kids picture and chapter books. The best part is there are no late fees! If you need technical assistance we are having two demo sessions at the library (see below.) Or stop in and talk with our trained staff.

Want to learn how to get started with Overdrive ebooks? Join us for two free Overdrive demos on **January 24, or February 21 at 6:00pm**. Learn how to download ebooks onto different portable devices including Nooks, Kindles, ipads, and more. Bring in your tablet or ereader if you have specific questions.

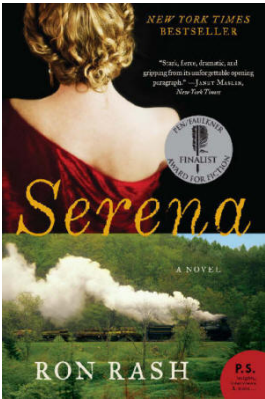

Probably not, but that shouldn't stop you from coming to 2 full hours of zombie themed fun!

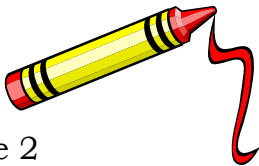

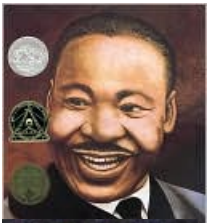
## Read Together Book Club for Parents & Kids

**Do you have children between the ages of 9 and 11?**

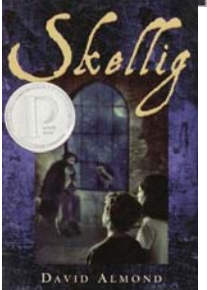
**Would you like to spend more time reading and discussing books as a family?**

**Do you want to take part in an enjoyable program that will help everyone in your family get more out of their reading experience?**

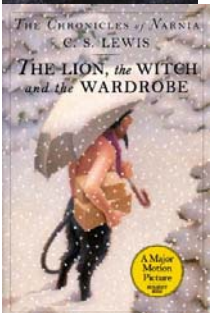

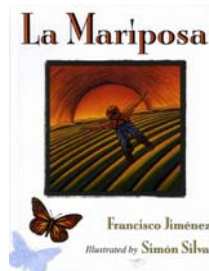

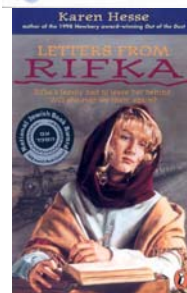

## **Borrow Our Nook**

Starting in mid-February we will have a Nook SimpleTouch ereader loaded with ebooks for you to borrow with your library card. The Nook can be checked-out for two weeks and is pre-loaded with new best-sellers for adults and teens. Each week we add one additional book to the Nook. Nook must be returned to the Canajoharie Library front desk if borrowed, not put in the book drop (for safety.) Check it out, read a book, or two and let us know what you think. In February ask at the library desk to see if the Nook is available to borrow.
