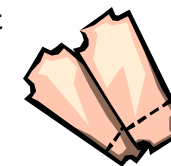

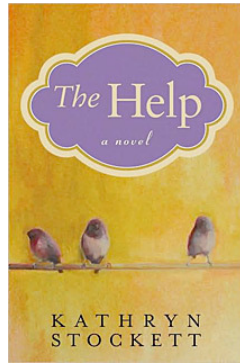

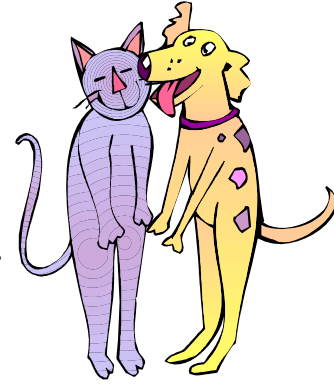
Book Discussion

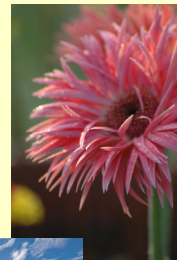
